AFTER SCHOOL PROVISION

We are delighted to start offering wrap around care at the end of the day. We will run the after school club until Easter and evaluate its success moving forward into the summer term. The cost per session is £5, which will include a snack, drink and activities. 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START TO THE NEW TERM

Everyone has settled very well into the Spring Term and it has been lovely seeing lots of fabulous learning taking place across the school. Class 1 have embraced having Mrs Brewer as their new teacher and Class 2 have welcomed Miss Godbeer to support their learning. Class 3 have also welcomed two students, Beth Lush from Exeter Consortium, a SCITT PGCE student, and Chloe Hodgson from Exeter College. It is always great having students as they bring with them fresh ideas and an extra pair of hands!

Kate Murray is continuing with Dance for Class 1 and 2 on Monday afternoons; when possible this will be done on the playground so please make sure children have sensible PE kit on those days. Class 3 start Forest School Mondays after half term, with Year 1's going for 3 weeks and then Foundation for 3 weeks. The Class 3 team will be in touch beforehand to give you more information.

As a school, we are having a focus on 'number facts' this term and on Thursdays all Maths lessons will revolve around fluency with number. Children need to have a bank of 'known' facts before they can tackle bigger problems. It is important the children have core knowledge embedded and we aim to support this by revisiting and over-learning these key mathematical building blocks. We are re-launching Times Tables Rockstars in March with a 'dress up like a rockstar day'. This is a fantastic opportunity for everyone to get on board and learn their times tables. Mr Fenton will be introducing some great incentives so children can earn housepoints for their team the more they practise their tables.

THE RIVER OF HOPE

We are very excited to take part in an art project called River of Hope, it will form a central part of The Queen's Platinum Jubilee celebrations. The Queen has always shown a great love and respect for the natural environment and the project will encourage pupils to think about the importance of safeguarding the future of their own natural environment and the world they would like to live in.

We will create a collaborative design including every child in the school. The designs will go onto an online gallery and two hundred, from across the world, will be printed onto silk flags for the Platinum Jubilee Pageant.

END OF THE DAY

End of the day routines are working well with classes coming out staggered by a few minutes but can we please ask parents of our younger children to ensure they come closer to gate so children can be released easier. This will ensure a smoother hand over for the children.


