

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Quality of Education-

Our aim was for a greater % of chn to make accelerated progress in Maths and Writing. Our KS2 results have not met this target in Maths as we were below national, however, in Writing we have exceeded the national average 69% and after taking part in robust external moderation we achieved 72%. We were also above national in SPAG- national: 72% and Cockwood 78%. As Writing has been an area we have been trying to improve for the last 3 years this is encouraging.

GW has met with teachers to discuss SEND pupils on a regular basis, this has ensured support has been targeted when needed. We have utilised the services of SLT across the school and small steps of progress have been tracked.

OG in Class 2 has been supported well by all staff during the summer term and GW will be her mentor in September as she starts as an ECT.

Still to do: Target groups to be identified for next year, based on TT results. Objectives to be all updated on TT by the end of term.

Behaviour and Attitudes -

Staff were given a day out of class and staff meetings were postponed to support their workload writing reports, which they were very grateful for. Everyone has become more confident logging incidents on CPOMS and this is becoming the norm.

All chn have been to Forest School this term for a 2 week block, with a focus on mental health and enjoying the natural environment. This was particularly beneficial the week after SATs for Year 6.

Helen Wilson from Open Minds has worked with a child needing social and emotional support, this is on-going.

Still to do: GW to review effectiveness of PSHE Curriculum and policy to ensure it reflects key priorities

Personal Development-

AR and LB have completed the 3 day intensive Voice 21 training and an implementation plan is in place to feed into the SIP next year.

The Youth Parliament event was a success and 6 schools across the trust attended.

All teaching staff attended Tom Sherrington CPD and came away with ideas we want to implement across the school in Sept.

Still to do: identify the key chn we are going to monitor next year for Oracy, Oracy Champions to have time to work on the whole-school approach so we are ready for the new academic year

Leadership and Management -

Rights and Respect leads across the trust met and collaborated on ideas for the Youth Parliament event.

We have achieved Bronze Rights and Respect and now working towards Silver.

Whole school event to celebrate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee was a great success and was attended by 220 people.

Residentials were well-organised and offered pupils enrichment opportunities.

All staff have worked hard to ensure every child has increased their cultural capital this year, through visits, sporting events, visitors into school and residentials
