READING WORKSHOP

Reading is a fundamental skill for all children although from my own experience, every child is unique in how quickly they pick up this skill as well as how enthusiastic they are to embrace it! On Wednesday 30 November, I attended the reading workshop where Mrs Roper and Mrs Watts took a small group of parents through the reading programme Cockwood School follows and how the Accelerated Reading system works; further details of these schemes can be found online here. https://www.renlearn.co.uk/accelerated-reader/. Listening to other parents reassured me that I wasn't alone in some of the challenges we all face as busy families. I wanted to share some of my own learning to hopefully provide some help so in terms of some top tip:

Interest: try to select books for your child to read that match their interests. Once a child can read the world is their oyster although to start with it helps if they read things they have a natural interest in.

Energy: choose a time to read when you and your child have sufficient energy; that might be at the breakfast table in the morning before school or as soon as you get in from school in the afternoon. Creating a routine will ensure you have dedicated time for reading and you will see the positive progress your child is making.

Motivation: you may need to motivate your child with a reward system. This might be agreeing daily, weekly or monthly goals. We use marbles in a jar at home and then at the end of every month we count up the marbles and agree in advance what the reward will be; this might be a trip to the park or swimming pool, whatever works for you and your family.

Along with all of these I would also STRONGLY recommend reading to your child as part of their bedtime routine (or anytime that fits with you). Reading together creates a special bond and I personally love being as adventurous as possible with the voices of characters, you will get as much fun out of it as your child does!

CHILDREN OF THE WORLD CHRISTMAS SHOW




