Tapestry has been put in place in response to the parent survey last year that asked for more information on your child's learning journey but for it to be effective we do need more parents to add a like so we know you have seen the photo. We will assess the effectiveness and parental engagement at the end of the Summer Term.

CLASS 1 NEWS WISE

Class 1 are currently involved in a project funded by The Guardian Foundation, the Literacy Trust and PSHE Association. It is supporting pupils to tackle misinformation in the press and be critical consumers of the media. It is designed to increase the confidence of pupils in navigating the news and how to think like a reporter and create their own news story. To support them in writing their own news reports they have taken part in an online workshop, interviewed Mrs Brown from The Ship Public House in Cockwood and next week they are having a question and answer session with a journalist. CLASS 2 TRIP TO RAMM EXETER














